# **FLOWER SHOWS 2021 – 2022**

## Floral Design & Horticulture

This was a particularly lovely year for our shows as we were able to return to being in person. Plus, to kick-off the year members enjoyed beautiful floral designs and horticulture specimens displayed in Woodley Hapgood's bespoke home—giving us time to enjoy them as we socialized at the opening cocktail party. Special thanks to Woodley for graciously allowing us to take over her home with displays throughout. Ten members participated across three Floral Design classes, with luscious and creative arrangements. Nine members contributed multiple cuttings and gorgeously curated plants, creating lovely displays along the kitchen island, family eating area and beautiful porch. Staging a show in a new location takes a certain leap of faith and patience on the part of the passers. We are very grateful to our veteran members who handled the new location and pouring rain with calm a plumb! Once again, GCW held up its reputation with a beautiful lunch for the judges catered by none other than our own Lynn Carbonell who also wears the hat to lead the judging sub-committee. Lynn made us shine! Overall, the Fall 2021 Flower Show was a lovely pairing with the Club's season-opening cocktail party.

This Spring our Floral Design and Horticulture Show returned to Vicmead Hunt Club. Floral Designs "Showcasing the Arts," drew inspiration from music, fine art, literature, with 8 entries. The Hort specimens wrapped the room with a terrific array of narcissus, gorgeous near black iris, luscious tree peonies, manicured topiary and much more. To see what members grow in their gardens and tend in their homes is always inspiring. Wendy Russell and Lynn Carbonell report that our shows are very highly regarded by the visiting judges. Congratulations to everyone who exhibited and special appreciation to the great team of passers and clerks who made the show run smoothly, Special thanks to Beverley Rowland who stepped in to work with the judges, and to our own Wendy Russell assembles the judging panels for ALL Zone V shows!

#### **Photography**

Members met the challenge of creative class assignments in the Fall Photography show, themed "The Wizard of Oz," drew entries from nine exhibitors; followed by the Spring show, "Four Seasons." Mary Patterson, Zoe Simonds and their committee take the helm with organizing these shows. Hats off to them for engaging our members and staging impressive shows.

#### **Botanical Arts**

New, and a highlight of the show year, was an exhibit of Botanical Arts, a retrospective of members' creations over the years. We expanded beyond GCA's traditional classifications to include botanical illustration in watercolor, pencil, and oil; needlepoint fashioned into pillows, rugs, jewelry boxes, seat covers for chairs and benches, a wedding ring pillow, scissor sleeve, Christmas stockings, doll blankets and even a fireplace screen! Meticulous Sailor's Valentines, a Critter Creche, botanical jewelry as well as jewelry in precious metals with botanical subjects, dried floral wreath and even paddle tennis balls designed to look like a basket of mushrooms (!) garnered much attention as everyone enjoyed this abundant display of members' talents and passions! We are grateful to Susan Parker for helping to steer Lynn Carbonell and me in this new territory, and to our set-up assistants Peggy Barton, Elaine Scott. Most importantly, our appreciation goes to the 19 members who generously shared 52 cherished creations with us! Members lingered a good while around the show, hearing our member artists' stories and generally visiting with each other.

#### Closing and Pitch for 2022-2023!

Each of these shows go to the heart of GCA's mission to "stimulate the knowledge and love of gardening, to share the advantages of association" through educational programs and actions.

In every show extraordinary talents of our members are on display, however our closing message is, every exhibitor started somewhere! Don't be afraid to enter! The shows are also an opportunity to learn, to share, to be inspired, to find a mentor and, importantly, to share the camaraderie of other members while producing, entering or viewing the shows. We hope that each of you will participate in one or more shows next year. Veteran members would love to receive your call with questions as you prepare, back by popular demand, Wendy Russell will offer a detailed workshop on preparing for Flower Shows, and to get your wheels turning, a preview of Flower Show classes is available for each of you today [at the annual meeting] — perhaps you'll plant a new perennial with a floral or hort class in mind, or keep a keen eye this summer for a subject for one of the photography classes. The classes and guidelines will also be posted to our website this summer. Let your imagination start to churn as our Fall Show will be at the opening cocktail party once again, September 15th just a week after Labor Day.

Again, thank you again to everyone who exhibited and assisted with the five Shows this year.
